Adult Role Models

Tips for building this asset

According to experts, what most young
people need more than anything else in
their lives is positive social interaction with
adults. These interactions expose young
people to real-life heroes. Be a role model
for the young people around you, and help
them find other responsible adults to be
part of their lives as well. The more positive
role models young people have, the better!

Also try this

In your home and family: Do
your best to model appropriate be-
havior at all times. When you make
mistakes, admit them. Apologize for
missteps.

**In your neighborhood and com-
munity group:** Don’t be afraid to
start a conversation with a young per-
son in your neighborhood. Begin by
asking: How did you meet your best
friend? What is your favorite family
tradition?

**In your school or youth pro-
gram:** As a group, list questions
young people can ask their adult role
models to learn more about choices
they made. Then, have students or
participants interview that person.
Discuss their findings.
